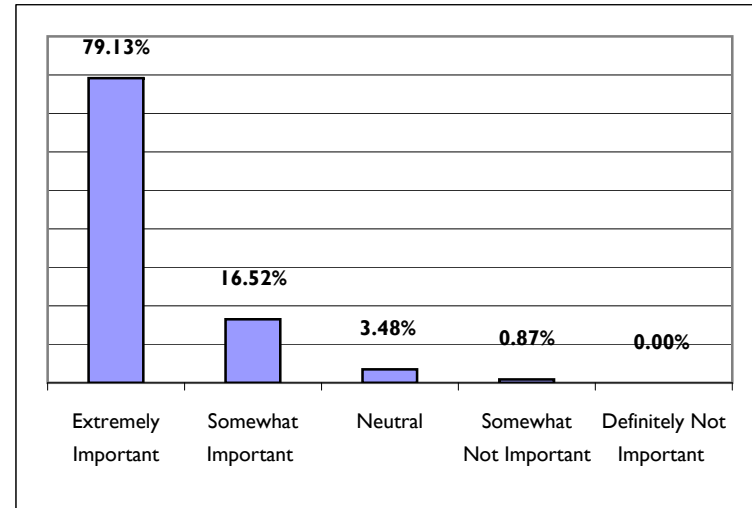

Goal #1: The City of Cincinnati promotes the health and well-being of its residents.

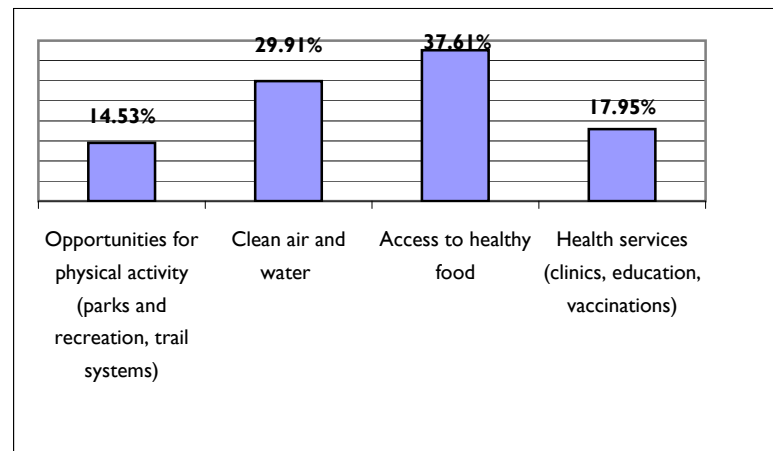
*How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?

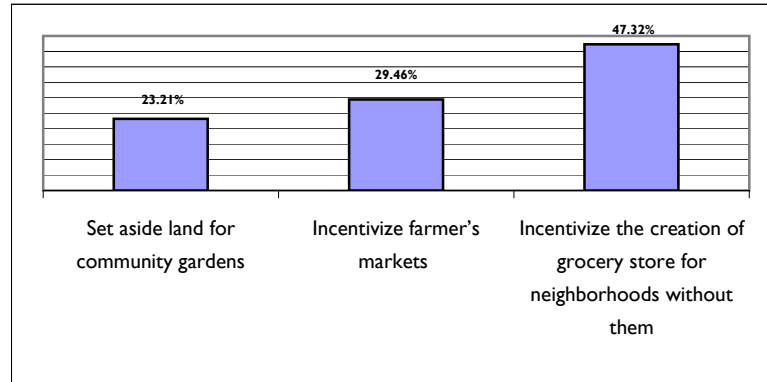

Critical Question: How could Cincinnati improve food access?

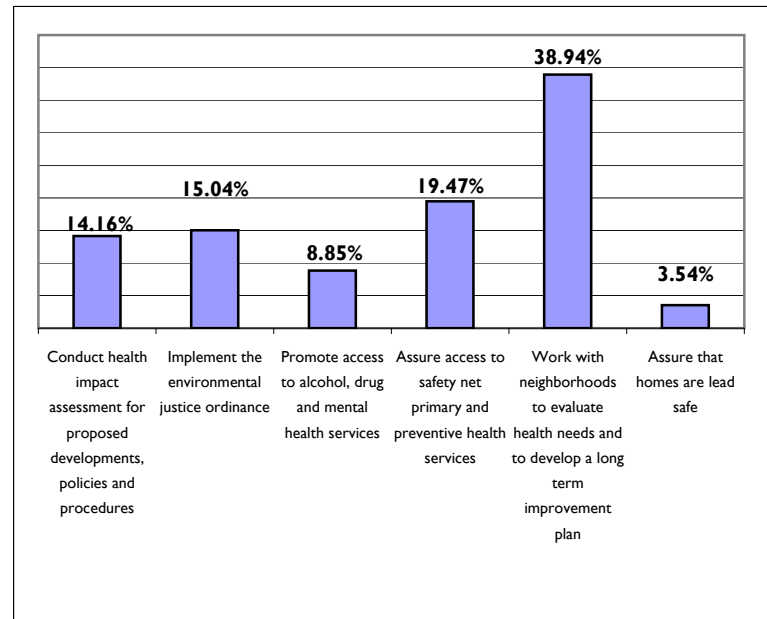
*How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?

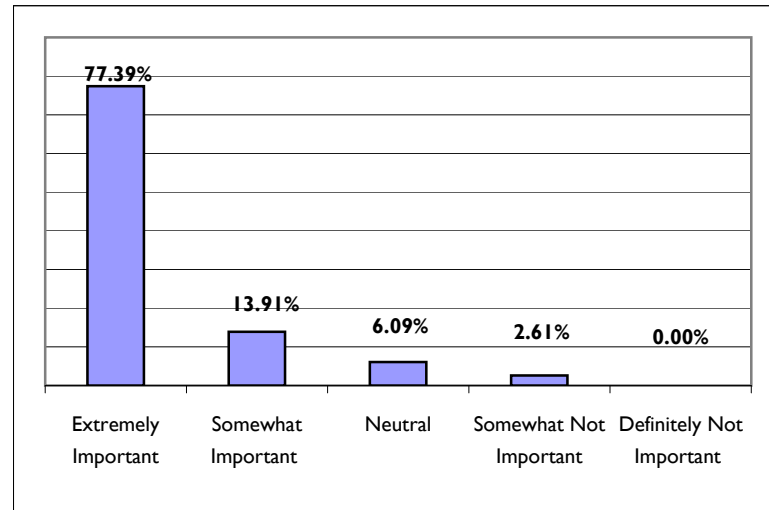

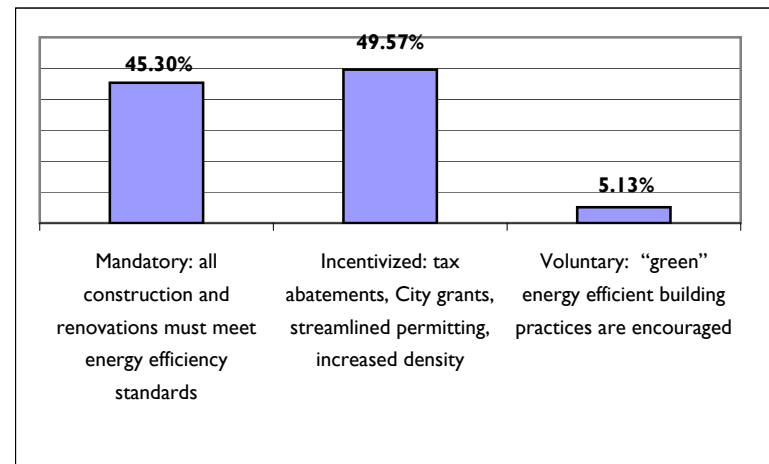
*How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?

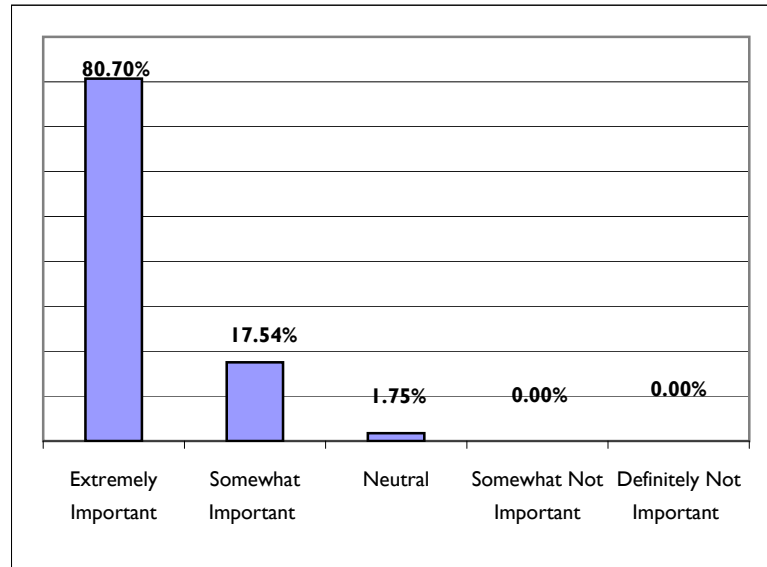

Goal #3: Natural resources, including hillsides, views, wildlife, forests, and waterways, are protected.

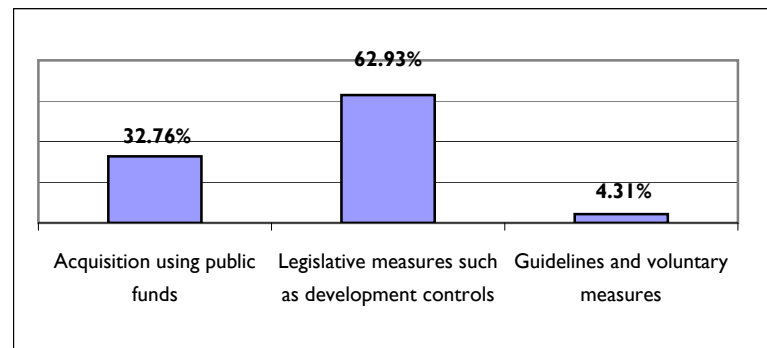
*How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?

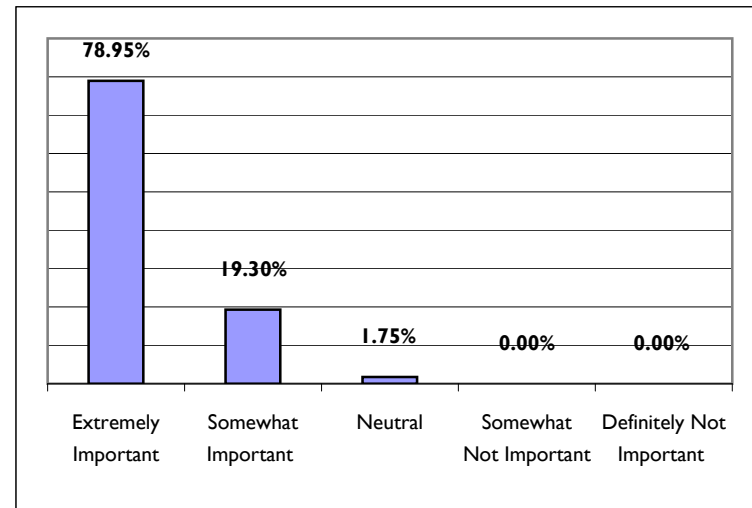

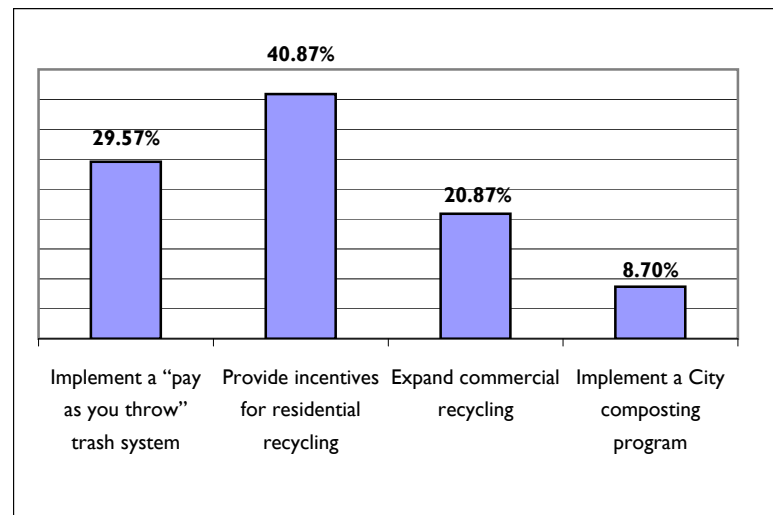
How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?

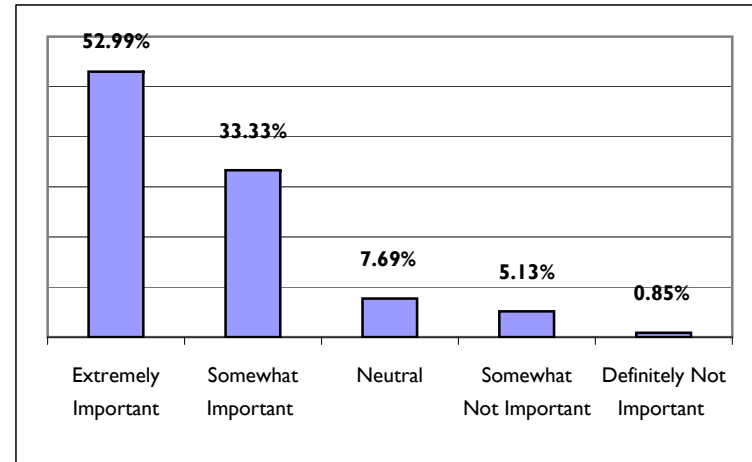

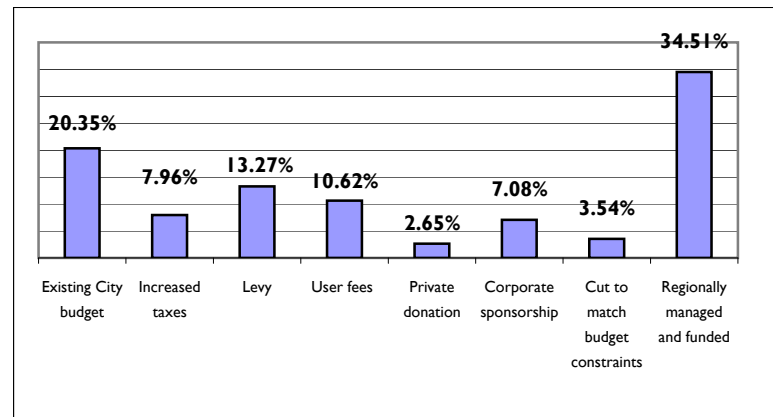
*How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?

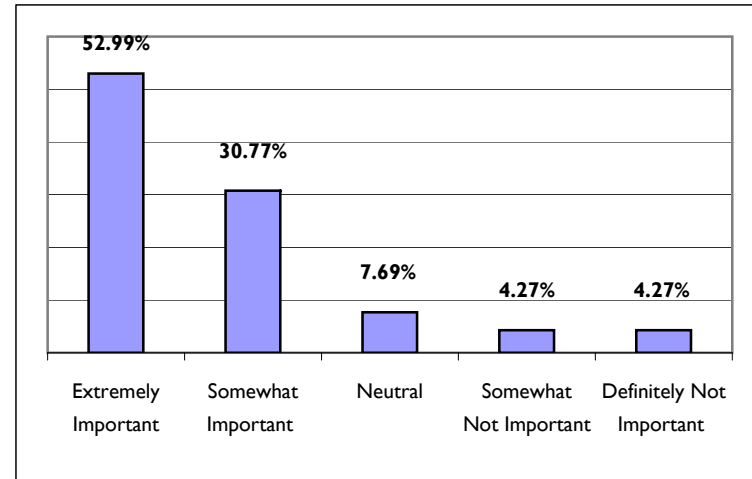

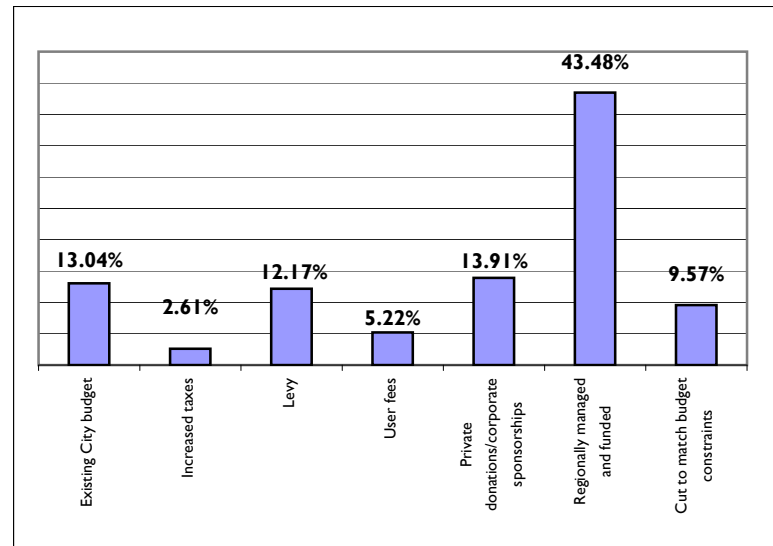
How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?

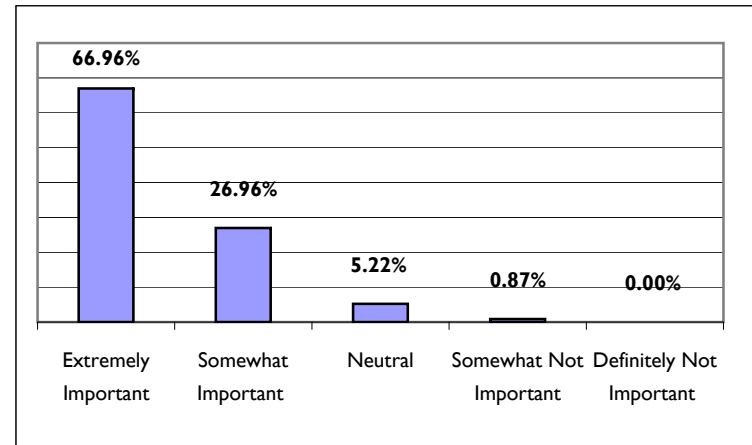

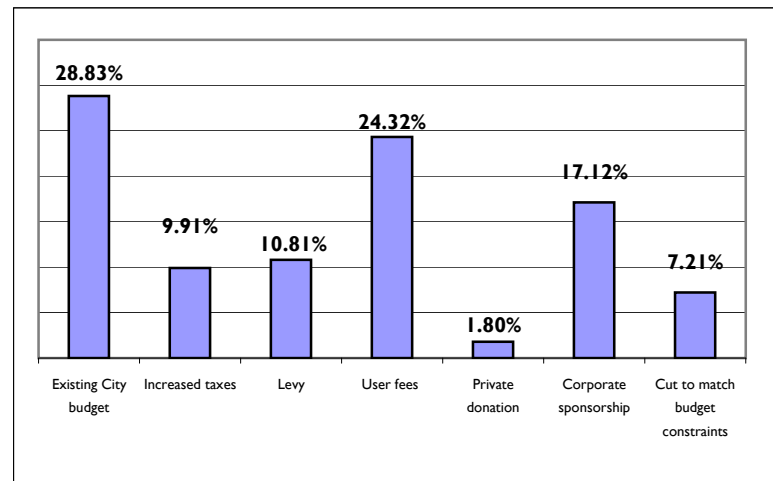
How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati?
