

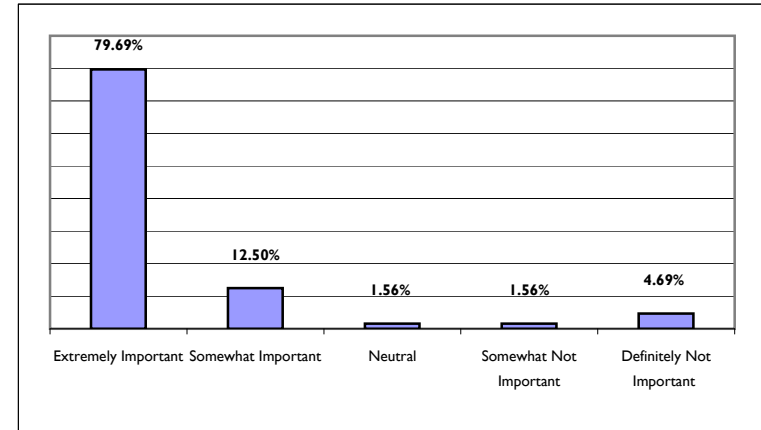

(multiple choice)*

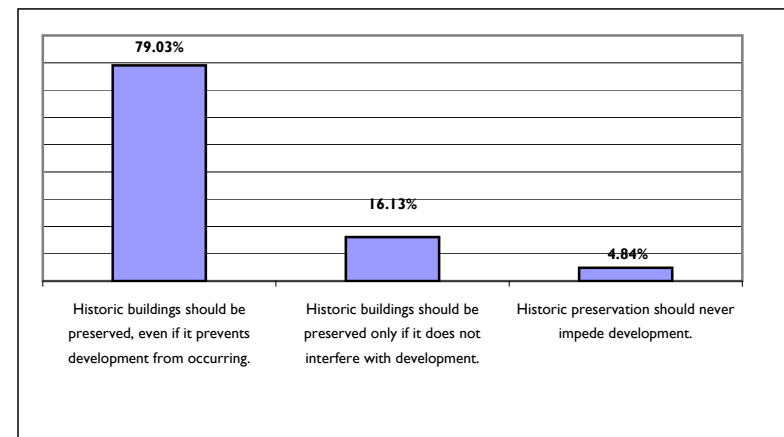

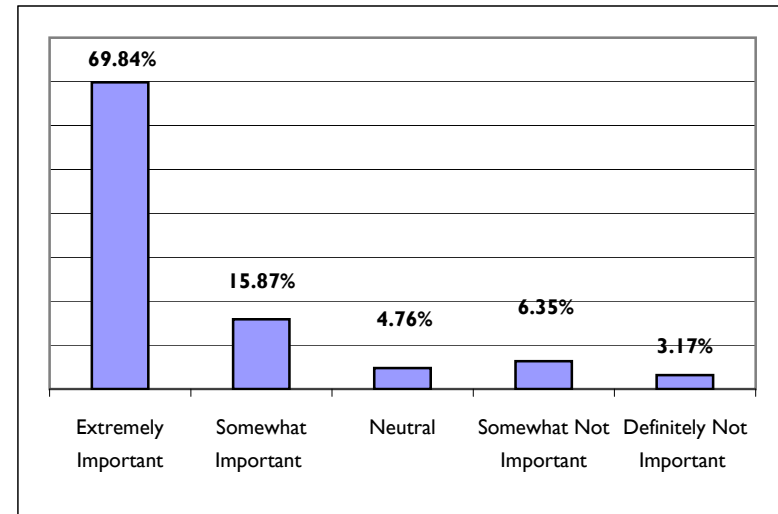

(multiple choice)*

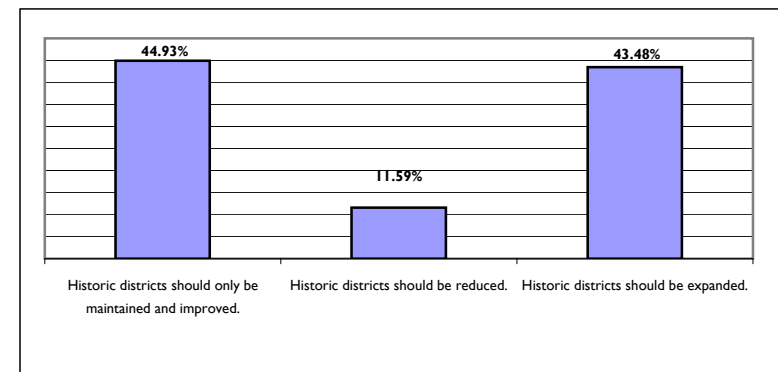

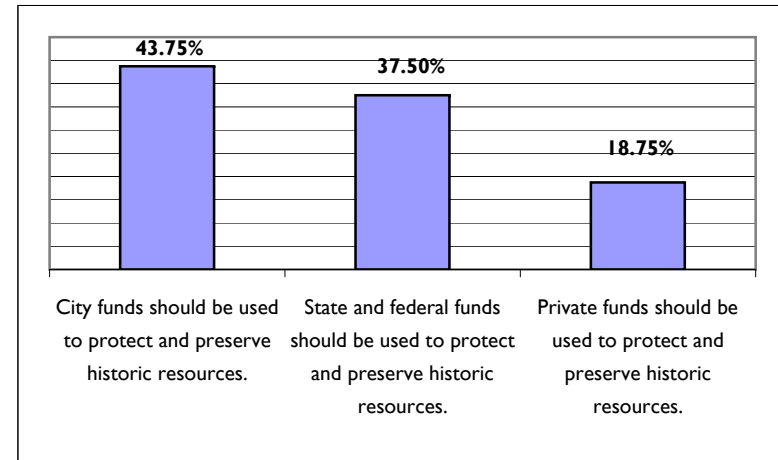

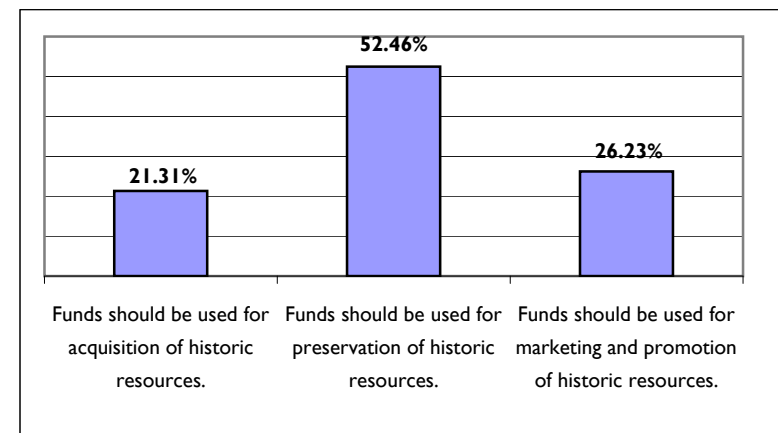

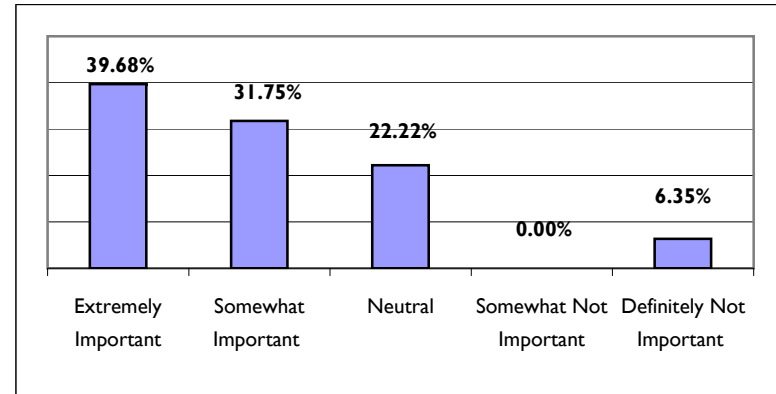

(multiple choice)*

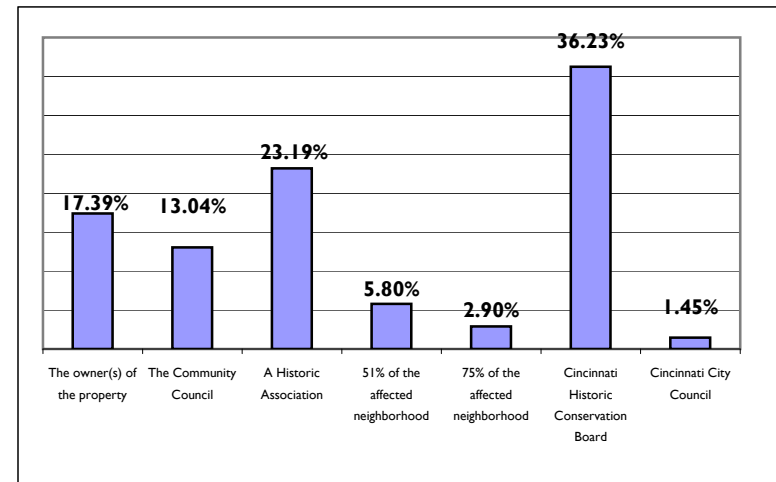

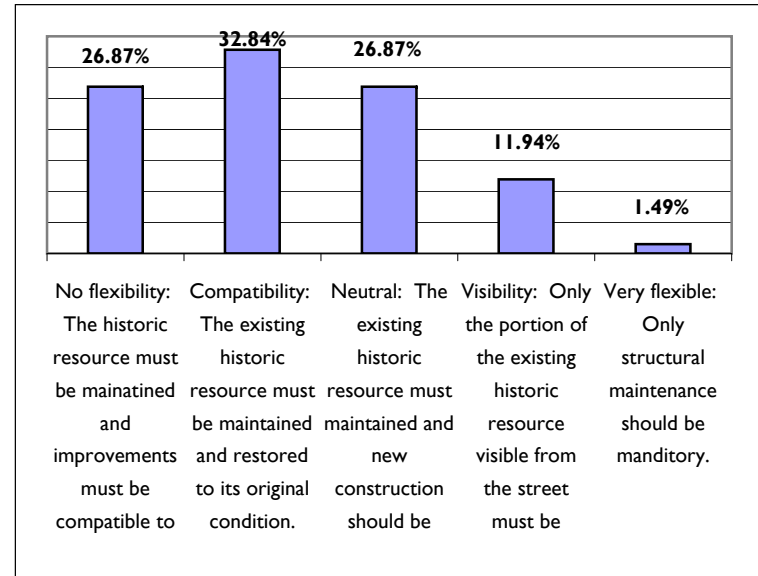

**Critical Question: Should the historic development regulations be flexible?**

	Responses	
	#	%
No flexibility: The historic resource must be maintained and improvements must be compatible to the existing architecture.	18	26.87%
Compatibility: The existing historic resource must be maintained and restored to its original condition.	22	32.84%
Neutral: The existing historic resource must maintained and new construction should be compatible to existing architecture if it is not cost prohibitive.	18	26.87%
Visibility: Only the portion of the existing historic resource visible from the street must be maintained.	8	11.94%
Very flexible: Only structural maintenance should be mandatory.	1	1.49%
