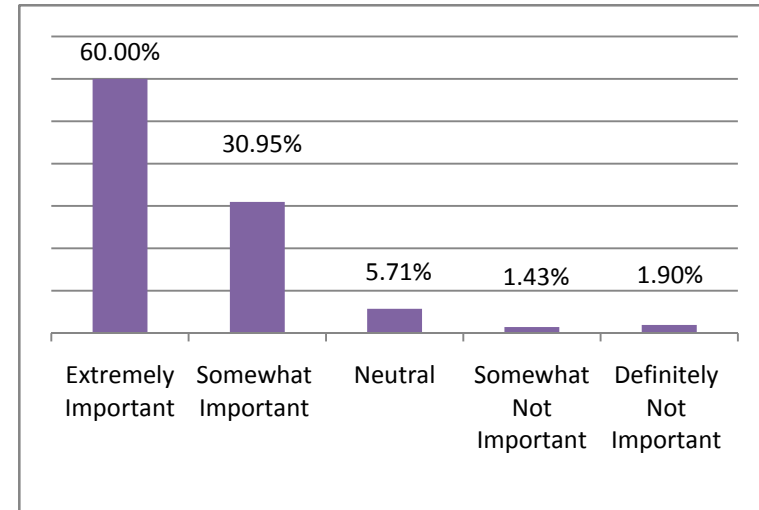

 (multiple choice)

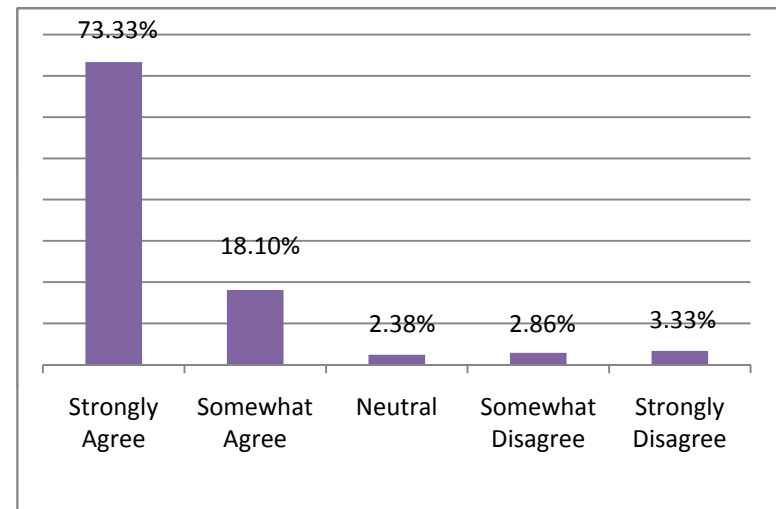

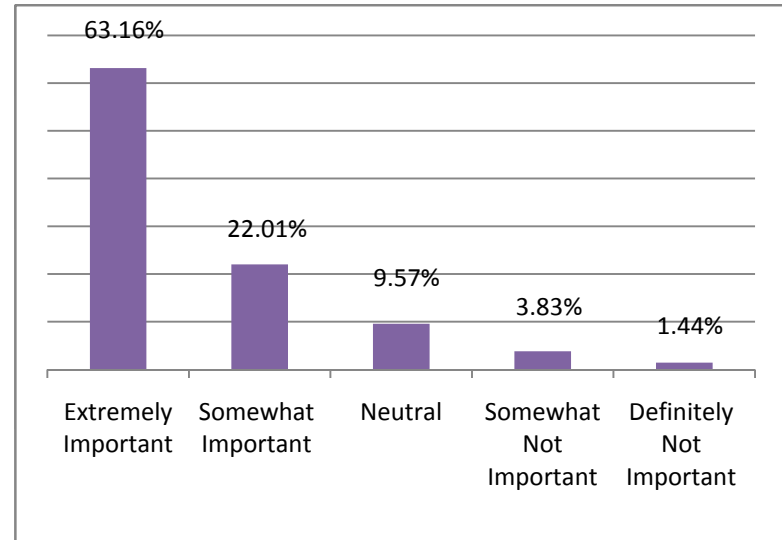

How important do you feel this is to the future of Cincinnati? (multiple choice)

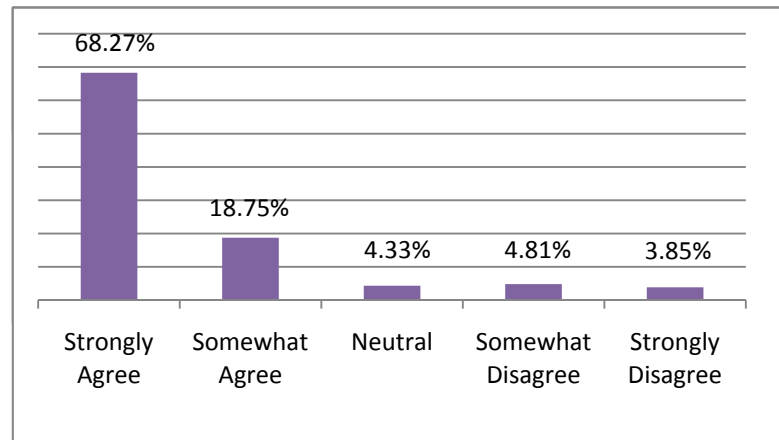

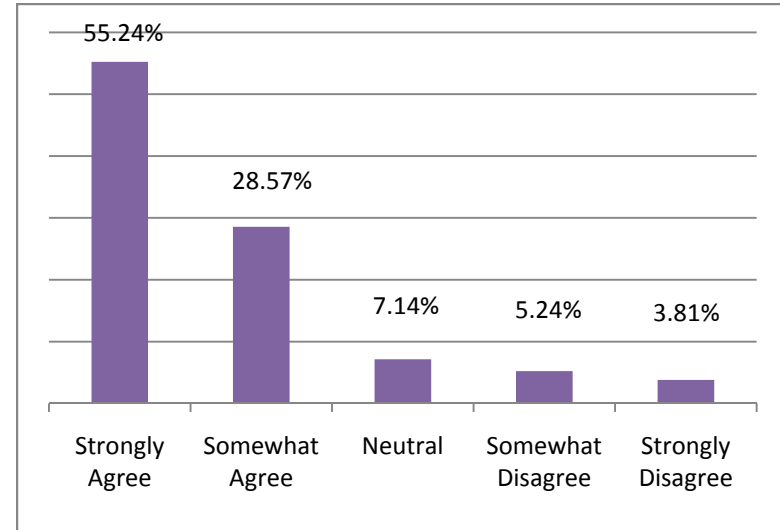

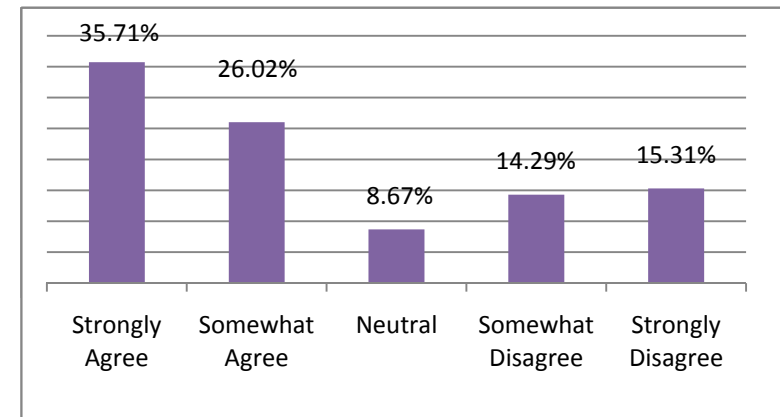

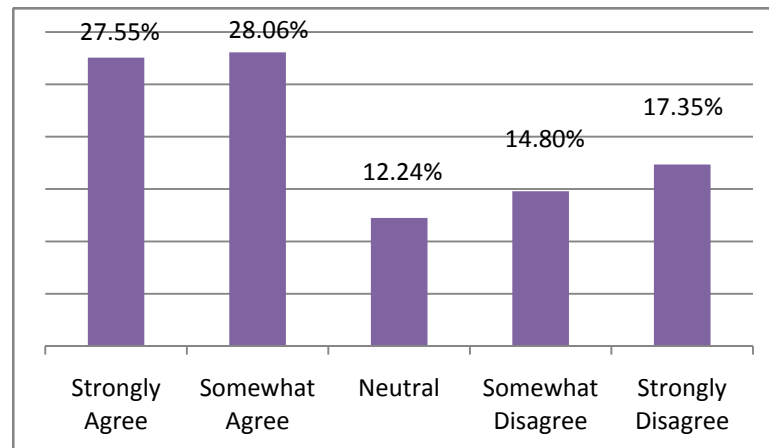

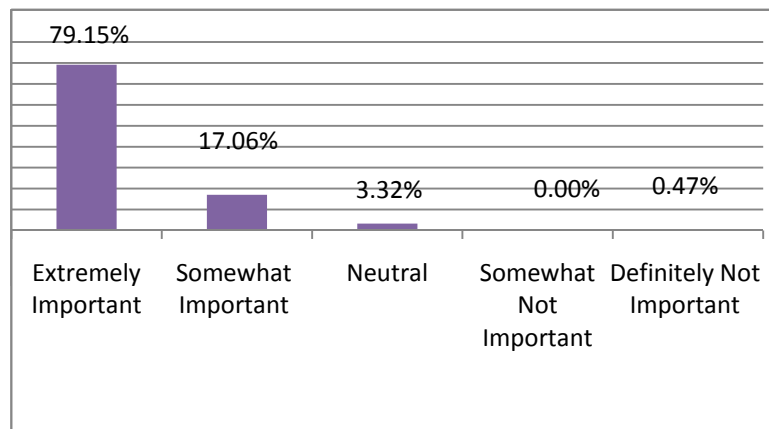

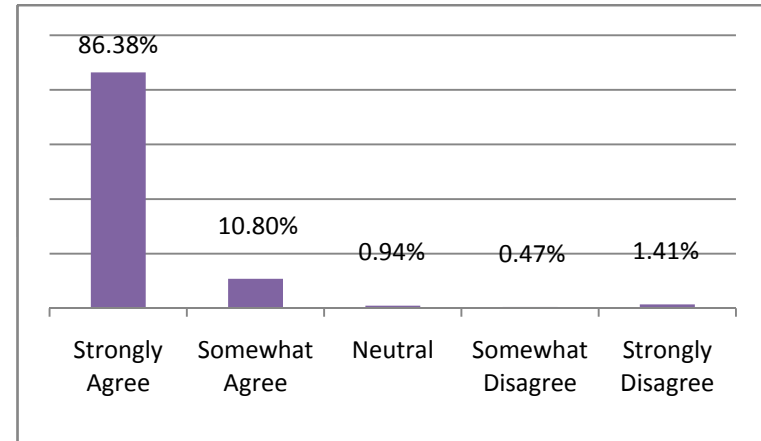

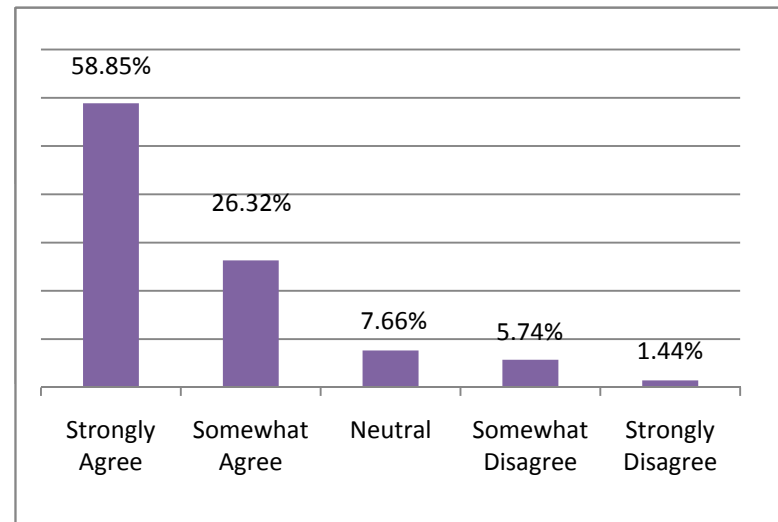

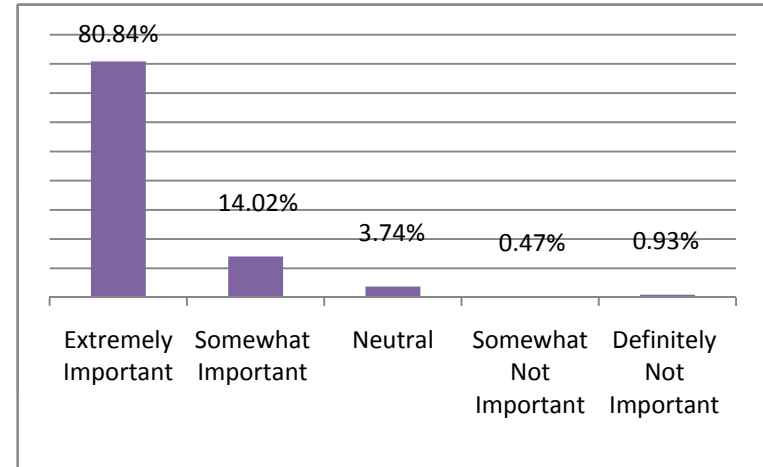

 (multiple choice)*

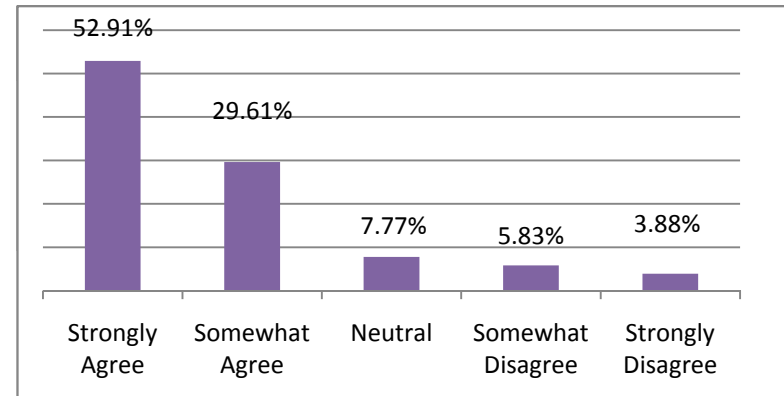

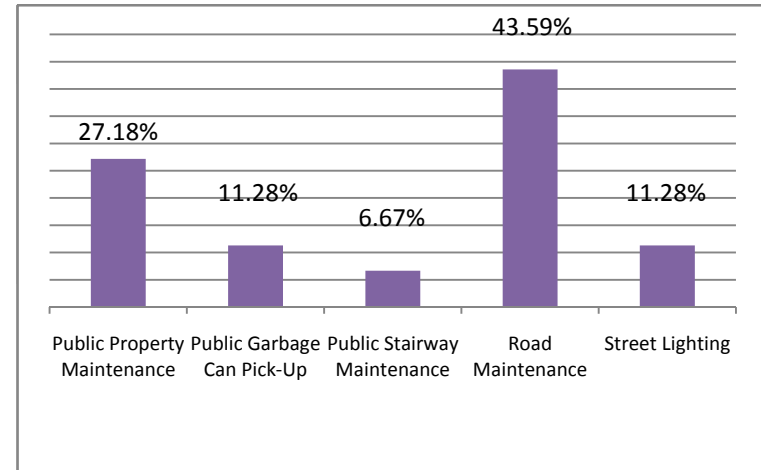

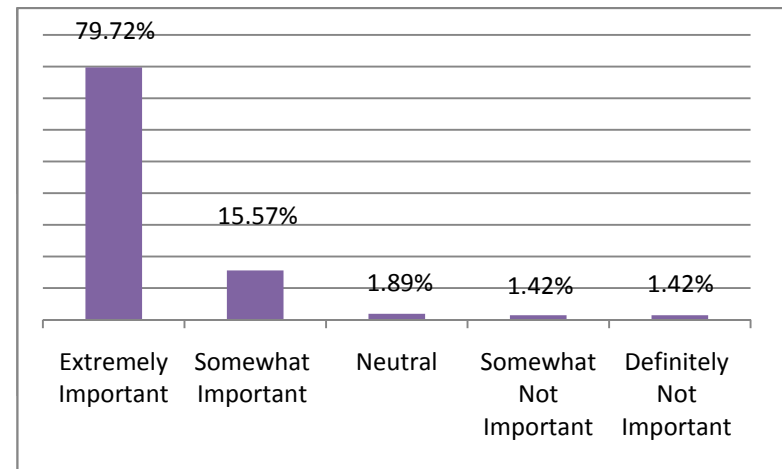

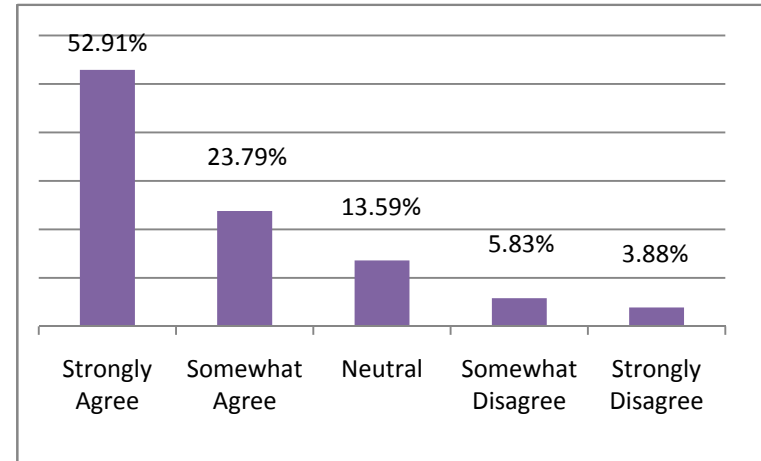

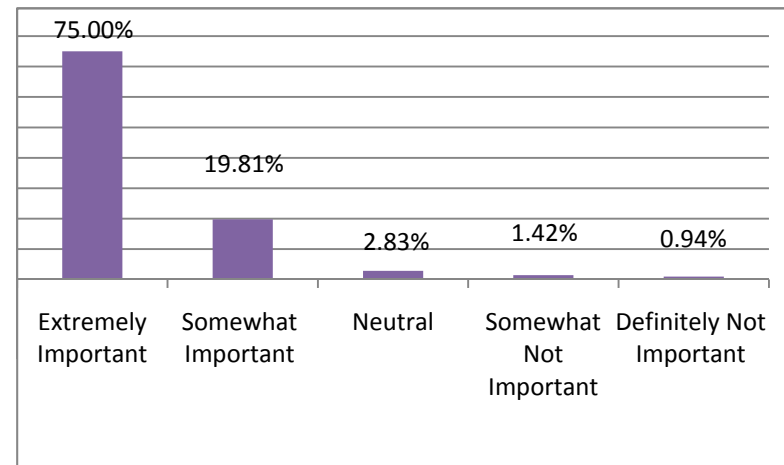

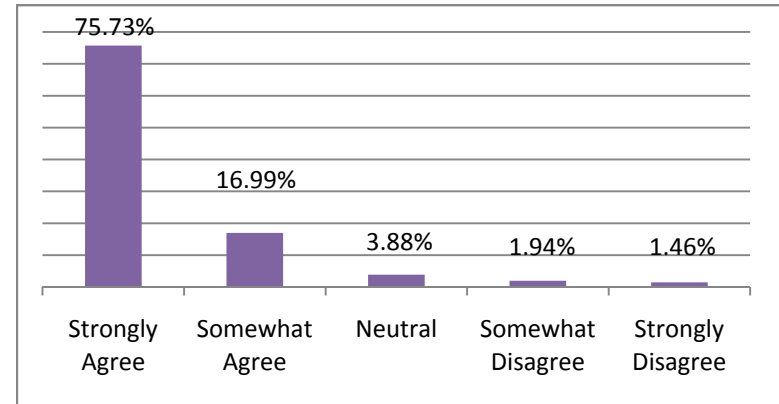

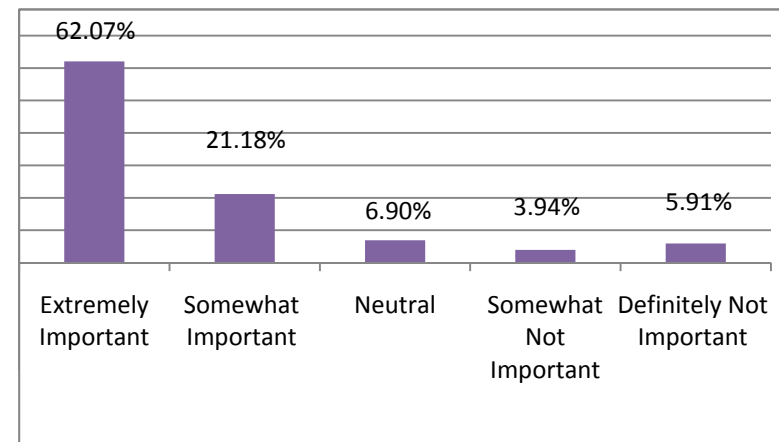
