Population growth/change locationally
Inventory of unused space / under utilized
Basic demographic data
When are heavy visitation times? Traffic patterns for employees, patrons
What organizations/institutions are open at night? What are hours? Can residents access services?
What other services do institutions already provide to public? - beyond core mission (especially free)
Accessibility to people of all abilities (ADA, Universal Design)
Zoning restrictions - can keep institutions from coming in or getting out - can be good or bad
Historic preservation - regulations may make it more challenging to grow
Form-Based Codes may be a positive option
Infrastructure and Utilities - tie to Institutions to ensure capacity - Institutions can positively & negatively influence
Environmental impact positives and negatives
Technology advancing - may change how we use institutions in the future - library, school
Sharing spaces between institutions potential parking, public spaces
Balance - do we have too many of one thing in one place?
What is missing? - Accessible services may help balance neighborhoods demographically
Economic trends - impact physical space
